

### **ARRIVAL** (semester 1)

### TUITION FEES PAYMENT

We remind you that beneficiaries of the Erasmus Mundus scholarship do not have to pay the tuition fees.

In all other cases, tuition fees must be paid to the University Paris-Saclay, irrespective of the mobility path chosen.

The payment must be done before enrollment at the university (before the beginning of September).

The payment must be done by bank transfer with the following conditions:

1) The transfer must be made in Euros.

2) The transfer purpose should indicate: "Tuition fees SERP master (+ your name)"

3) You should provide us with a clear receipt of your bank with, at least, the following information:

- your name,
- · date of the transfer,
- · amount of the transfer,

to whom the transfer was made (the name of the university should appear),
the transfer reference (code or number).



# ENROLMENT AT THE UNIVERSITY

### Documents to be prepared:

• Identity card or Passport (EU) / Passport and visa (non EU)

- 1 passport photograph
- Acceptance letter

 Certified translation to French or English of your Bachelor or Master diploma (certified copy of the original document). In case you do not have yet the diploma, a graduation certificate can be accepted (translation + certified copy).

Once you are registered, you're student ID card will be issued. This card will be required for your exams and to borrow books in the library. But it is also a payment method. You can use it in the cafeterias. You can load credit on your card online via www.izly.fr

### French social security

Registration to social security is free and <u>mandatory</u> for all non EU students in France.

### ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is the most difficult part of the preparation of your stay in France. The master will ask a room for all students in public halls of residence called «CROUS» (a state-body institution managing student residences, which is independent from the university). However, we cannot guarantee that all the students will be accepted by the CROUS. In case you will not given a CROUS accommodation, the university will guide you and give you several contacts to find an accommodation on the private market.

The CROUS procedure is often complicated, it takes time and a lot of paperwork. We will do our best to help you and solve the problems! So do not hesistate in contacting us so we can follow the status of your application.

### What's the procedure?

1. The accommodation service of the university will contact you (around June/July) and ask you to fill in a form, to choose between different accommodation options.

 The CROUS will contact you by email and send you a "Housing proposal" ("proposition d'accueil"). Read the step by step guideline here : https://tinyurl.com/2tycwis7

If you decide to reject the offer, you will have to find your own alternative accommodation, the CROUS will not make a second offer. However it can be possible to change of residence after your arrival, not the first month but in October, by simply going to the reception of the residence and filling in a transfer form.

3. In France, it is compulsory to have a «guarantor». As an international student, it is difficult for you to find a French person to act as a guarantor. You will thus have to go through the VISALE procedure: https://tinyurl.com/274ndr53

### 4. Housing insurance.

To complete your CROUS procedure, you will also have to get a housing insurance. We propose you to take the following insurance:

### Accommodation offer.

The main CROUS residences located close to the campus are the following:

•La Pacaterie (single rooms with shared kitchen and bathroom - monthly rent between150 - 250 euros)

•Residence de l'Ile, Jardins de Fleming, Rives de l'Yvette, Eileen Gray (single rooms with private kitchen and bathroom, monthly rent between 350 - 550 euros)

 Jean Zay, located in the city of Antony, between Paris and the Campus (single rooms with private kitchen and bathroom, monthly rent between 350 - 550 euros)

We advise you not to choose a single room with shared kitchen and bathroom. Even if it is less expensive, the residences proposing this type of accommodation are old and less comfortable that the others. Please note that sheets and blankets as well as plates and cutlery are not provided.

On the day of arrival, you should be able to pay for the annual deposit and the rent of September. The deposit you paid online to confirm the booking will be deducted from the total amount.

### Housing benefit (APL)

This benefit is designed to help the students bearing the housing costs. The amount you receive depends on your rent.

### **BANK ACCOUNT**

Many Erasmus Mundus students choose to open an account with the online bank Revolut, which is particularly convenient for travelers: www.revolut.com/en-FR

Alternatively, you can visit any local bank branch to request the opening of a bank account.

Please note that the scholarship can only be transferred to a European bank account.

Beneficiaries of the Erasmus+: Erasmus Mundus scholarship should send a copy of their bank account details to the manager of the master as soon as they receive it. The scholarship will be transferred to this account for the whole duration of the programme. In other countries, espacially Poland (which is not part of the Euro zone), in order to avoid bank charges you can open another account and transfer your scholarship on it (free transfers).

### University account activitation – Wifi

In order to activate your university account:

- Fill in the fields Login and Password (can be find on your registration certificate)

Afterwards, you must change the default password.

- Go to the URL: https://adonis.upsud.fr
- Fill in the fields Login and Password (the default which been assigned to the user during the activation of the account)
- Click on the icon Connect
- Click on the line "password" on the left of your screen
- Enter the requested information and validate the modification

Once you've got your account, you can access student email and the university WiFi - Eduspot or Eduroam. Eduroam is an international roaming service that can be used in almost all education and research institutions in Europe. With your codes from Paris-Sud university, you will be able to connect to the wifi in the other universities in Poland, Italy or Portugal.

### Transports

The Campus of Orsay (Faculty of Sciences) is situated in the south of the Paris region. You can reach the Campus of Orsay with the **RER line B** (suburbs railway). This line runs through the centre of Paris with se¬veral stops in Paris centre sFrom all the stops in Paris, you have access to the Metro of Paris which takes you all over the city

#### How to reach the University?

Take the RER line B, direction "Saint-Remy Les Chevreuses".

Stop at "Orsay-Ville", «Le Guichet» station or "Bures-sur-Yvette" station depending on where you need to go/

If you intend to frequently use the RER or Metro, buy a monthly pass (Imagine R card). It costs  $37\epsilon$ / month. You can get the documents for the subscription at the Orsay-Ville station.

Or the the line 9, from the RER station «Le Guichet». Direction - JOUY-EN-JOSAS or CHRIST DE SACLAY. Stop at "Université Paris-Saclay". Download the bus timetable here.

It is a place where you can get a free comprehensive range of services, all gathered in one place, to guide you through your administrative procedures related to your settlement in France.



Genoa is located in the north west of Italy, in the region called Liguria.

The University of Genova is organized in 5 Schools (Mathematics -Physical and Natural Sciences, Medical Sciences and Pharmacy, Social Sciences, Humanistic Sciences, and Polytechnic).

SERP+ classes will take place in the Department of Physics, via Dodecaneso 33

### ARRIVAL

Students who communicate their arrival time at least four days before can be welcomed to Genoa and picked up by fellow Erasmus students who already live and study in town.

These last will meet the newly arrived either at the airport or train or bus station, and help them to reach their accommodation.

# ENROLMENT AT THE UNIVERSITY

Enrolment will be done upon arrival in Genoa, at the central offices.

### Documents needed:

- Passport or ID card,
- 2 passport photos

 Academic title (original or certified photocopy), if this title is not written in English, French, Portuguese or Spanish, you need it to be translated into Italian.

the detailed courses and examinations passed to obtain the bachelor degree (transcript). Authentication not required, translation not required if the documents are provided in English, French, Portuguese or Spanish.

Once you have enrolled, you'll be given the **student ID card** and the **UniGepass Key** 

After enrolling at the University of Genoa, students will have to contact the Sass office to get information about the following necessary documents:

 Codice Fiscale (Italian Tax code): the Sass has all the forms that you need to apply for a fiscal code and will help you to fill-in the application forms,

 registration statement from the Registry office (for European students only),

• residence permit (for non-European students only).

### Accommodation

University dorms – choice of preference for the SEM2 students

Students can be accommodated at the **Casa dello Studente**, situated at foot distance from the Department of Physics. **An application by January 10th is needed** and a deposit must be paid (see below).

**Description:** single/double rooms with private bathroom. Sheets and blankets are provided, with free laundry, ironing and sheet replacement (provided by the residences) for all its guests. All residences are endowed with launderettes.

The monthly rent includes also the energy, heating, water and maintenance fees.

A cleaning company provides for the daily cleaning of every common space.

There is a LAN internet connection, study rooms, and a photocopy machine.

There are no common kitchens available and no oven is permitted, but cold meals can be eaten in the rooms. The canteen is inside the same building.

**Price (2017):**  $250 \notin 200 \notin$  per month, which become  $350 \notin 300 \notin$  with one meal per day (lunch or dinner) at the

canteen in the same building, and the possibility of buying the second meal at  $2 \in$ .

If this option is not chosen the canteen tickets cost around  $6,00 \in$ .

The monthly rent has to be paid by the 15th of each month. Broken months will be paid on a per diem basis.

**Deposit:**  $500 \notin /400 \notin$  must be paid upon application and will be reimbursed at the end of the stay.

### Opening hours:

The porter's lodge of the dorm closes around 10 pm, but on the day of your arrival, you have to check in by 14:00 in order to register.

For the check-in, you will be asked to provide the following documents (prepare copies):

- Passport /Identity document
- Codice Fiscale (Italian Tax Code)
- University card / presentation issued by the enrolment offices
- Residence Permit/ Application

Upon your arrival, you must be able to pay the rent of the first month.

If you decide to refuse the offer, you will have to find your own alternative accommodation. It is possible to find rooms in shared flat. Market prices are between  $150,00 \in$ and  $250,00 \in$ , all expenses excluded.

### **BANK ACCOUNT**

The currency used in Italy is the Euro.

Beneficiaries of the Erasmus Mundus scholarship will receive their scholarship on their French bank account opened during the first semester.

You can open an account with an Italian bank, the closest at hand being UniCredit Bank (see below).

Required documents:

 Application to the Vice-rector for Student's Affairs: you have to write this application by yourself, asking for admission for the degree course you are interested, it's kind of cover letter (template will be provided);

 Bachelor diploma and transcript of records (apostille / legalization no required)

• Translation of the above documents, unless they are issued in English

- Admission letter (English version)
- Identity document passport (or ID card for EU students)
- Insurance valid for period of stay in Poland
- Valid French residence permit or long-term visa

The student ID card will be ready when the Student Office creates the USOS account for you (after registration). Then you must uppload the photo in USOS account and send it to approval

### **BANK ACCOUNT**

The currency used in Poland is the Zloty.

Beneficiaries of the Erasmus Mundus scholarship will receive their scholarship on their French bank account opened during the first semester.

Two banks actually have the favour of international students in Poznań: DEUSTCH BANK and WBK BANK (English spoken). For students having BNP Paribas French account, there is no comission at DEUSTCH Bank ATM machines if you use the unknown conversion rate which is always the option you should choose. This is by far the best way to withdraw money in PLN.

Bank Polski offers also very good services with excellent conversion rates and almost all representatives can speak English.
